MUNDYS: "THE SPACE OF A JOURNEY", THE PODCAST ON INNOVATION AND MOBILITY, GOES ON AIR

✓ The infrastructure holding company launches a new format in partnership with Codice Edizioni to raise awareness of sustainable development issues.

Rome, 20 May 2024 - "The Space of a Journey" is the title of the new podcast season published by Mundys, in Italian and English, on the main platforms.

The project has been developed by the infrastructure holding company in collaboration with Codice Edizioni, the well-known Turin-based publisher specialising in scientific texts. It marks the company's desire to make the views of leading opinion makers, professors, scientists and intellectuals on issues around innovation and mobility, forming the cornerstones of Mundys's sustainable growth strategy, available to a wider audience.

The podcasts will enable listeners wishing to find out more about the role of technology in the environmental and social transformations currently taking place, above all in the mobility sector, to go on a "journey" in six episodes, to be released periodically from today through to the end of the year.

The podcasts will take the form of interviews with leading international experts conducted by an artificial intelligence system. The six speakers from the global academic, scientific and cultural communities who will take part in the dialogue with the AI bot are:

- David Weinberger, an American author considered a social web guru and a leading internet philosopher. He is a senior researcher at Harvard University's Berkman Center for the Internet and Society.
- · Anthony Elliott, a well-known Australian sociologist and university teacher who writes about identity, globalisation and the digital revolution.
- Mathis Wackernagel, a Swiss environmentalist and the founder and current President of the Global Footprint Network.

- Ersilia Vaudo, who holds a degree in Astrophysics. Since 1991, she has worked at the European Space Agency (ESA), where she is currently Chief Diversity Officer.
- Carlo Ratti, an architect and engineer who teaches at MIT in Boston, where he heads the Senseable City Laboratory.
- Kevin Kelly, an expert in technologies and the digital world and their impact on daily life, society and culture. He is a co-founder of Wired magazine.

All also plays a key role in how the format works: listeners to the podcast will be able to hear the original voices of the interviewees speaking perfect Italian thanks to an artificial intelligence system.

Thanks to the partnership between Mundys and II Foglio, a national newspaper, it will also be possible to read a transcription of the content of each podcast in the paper.
